## KLA AGM – Learning about caring for our trees


Our AGM was held on July 7th, 2018 at the Northbrook Lions Hall. There were 77 people in attendance to hear about the association activities, learn from our expert guest speaker, enjoy a delicious BBQ and socialize with their lake community.

Our presenter, arborist Coleman Boomhour of Trees and Beyond Ltd., shared his extensive knowledge of tree biology; management and maintenance; arboriculture and Canadian Law. He discussed how property owners can take a proactive approach to tree care and mitigate tree disorders, both abiotic (non-living agents) such as wind, lightening, ice/snow, erosion, flooding) and biotic (living) such as fungi, bacteria, viruses, bores and insects.



His presentation concluded with a Q&A with the audience on how to address such issues as the caterpillar infestation cycle and loss of shoreline trees (i.e.,

due to microburst). He noted that climate change has a rapid impact on trees and we are witnessing massive changes. You can find his <u>presentation</u> on our website.


#### Fall Dinner

## Lake Steward's Report - Peter Johnson

What a summer! It was hot, sunny, the caterpillars finally started to back off and even the mosquitoes weren't too bad. Fishing was pretty good too.

#### pH, alkalinity & water clarity

At the beginning of the season I began sampling eight different locations around the lake for pH and alkalinity. It quickly became apparent that I wasn't going to

detect subtle the pH and alkalinity. This can occur at different times of the day as well as

the coarseness of the test strips I was using. With that said pH was measured between 7.5 and 8 during the summer. This level is beneficial to aquatic organisms and helps resist the effects of acid rain. Alkalinity was measured at 80. This concentration helps resist example, Browns Bay, changes to pH which is also beneficial for the lake.

Water clarity this year has returned to normal historical levels of 4.5 to 5 m up from 3.5 m last year. I'm sure the limited rainfall helped.

#### **Eurasian Lake Milfoil**

I was contacted this summer from another lake representative inquiring about the status of Eurasian Lake Milfoil on our lake and what we were going to do about it. My first thought was, "What is Eurasian Lake Milfoil?" It turns out I've been snorkeling above it and through it for the past 16 years.

ELM is an invasive aquatic plant that's changes in been around for over 50 years. It has the ability to completely take over shallower, stiller lakes eliminating native aquatic plant species and negatively impacting aquatic organisms. It appears the season the Milfoil in my bay progresses has not increased over just due to the years. I have also counted at least four other aquatic plant species in and around the Milfoil which is a good sign. I checked the shallower, stiller areas of the lake, for near the dam, the South Narrows going into Mitchells Bay and Bullwark Bay. Milfoil is present but nowhere near the density I've seen in lakes that are inundated by it.

If you notice this weed spreading significantly, please contact me as there are ways of reducing it but none of them are great.

Enjoy the fall and winter and see you next spring!

## Lake Sustainability Implementation Update—Love Your Lake

The KLA Board of Directors along with members of our volunteer Lake Sustainability Implementation Committees attended the August board meeting and heard an excellent presentation from Andrew McNaughton, a summer student and Environmental Technician from Watershed Canada. Andrew walked us through the Love Your Lake Program, volunteer expectations and financial expectations. At the September meeting the KLA Board voted to approve moving forward with implementation of the Love Your Lake Program as the next major lake sustainability implementation project coordinated under the Water Quality, Shoreline Protection & Health Sub-Committee.

#### What is it?

The Love Your Lake program is a shoreline assessment and stewardship education program that was developed by Watersheds Canada and the Canadian Wildlife Federation. Confidential reports of individual shoreline assessments are provided to each property owner. This report will contain information about the state of their unique shoreline along with suggestions of voluntary actions they can take to improve the natural state of their shoreline and lake health. The KLA will receive a lake summary report which summarizes the data collected and identifies opportunities for community stewardship activities.

#### Why are we doing this?


#### New this year—Live Auction





## Lake Sustainability Implementation Update— Let's Get Tracking! *Flora & Fauna Sightings on the Lake*

The Flora & Fauna Lake Sustainability Implementations sub-committee successfully launched the new Let's Get Tracking online Survey in June.

As you will recall, tracking sightings of flora and fauna (plant and animal life) around the lake is an important part of the implementation of the <u>Kashwakamak Lake Sustainability Plan</u>. Your sightings help us know where you see birds, mammals, reptiles and amphibians as well as flora. With your help, we're now able to track threatened or endangered species, as well as keep an eye on species of "special concern".

Since the site was launched there have been **64** sightings reported and **10** people sent in photos. All reports are confidential and the location of the sightings will not be disclosed. The sub-committee will do a formal report at the end of October to highlight the first 6 months and will be included in our spring newsletter.

Of interest to note in the meantime is reports of:

- 2 Blanding turtles which are on the threatened list
- 1 snapping turtle on the special concern list
- 1 5 line skink on the special concern list



## Lake Sustainability Update

Attendees also received an update on the Lake Sustainability Plan and the sub-committees working on Water Quality and Shoreline Protection; Flora, Fauna, Wildlife & Forestry; and Communications. Initiatives included:

- The joint MVCA/KLA tree giveaway led by Peter Burbage and assisted by many other volunteers; 886 plants were distributed which was a record for the MVCA's program; Appreciation was expressed to Fernleigh Lodge and Woodcrest Resort for hosting the giveaway.
- The Let's Get Tracking survey, an ongoing online database to track plants and wildlife; the community was encouraged to participate and help develop an understanding of what is found where, and how this may change over time.
- Communications activities included the development of new welcome packages for new members and an ongoing presence on social media; the KLA has a vibrant Facebook community with 1,310 + members.



## Learn more about Eurasian Water-Milfoil

## How to Identify Eurasian Water-Milfoil

- The plant is a perennial that grows under the water surface.
- Feather-like green leaves circle the stem in groups of four or five.
- Leaves have up to 12 or more thread-like segments.
- Tiny, reddish flowers grow on spikes five to 20 centimetres long that rise above the water.
- The plant blooms in late July and early August.

### What You Can Do



- ⇒ Learn how to identify Eurasian water-milfoil and how to prevent accidentally spreading this plant with your watercraft or fishing equipment.
- ⇒ Avoid infested areas or reduce your speed when traveling near Eurasian water-milfoil infestations. Your propeller can break off fragments and spread the pieces to a new area. New plants can grow from small pieces of the plant.
- ⇒ Inspect your boat, trailer and equipment after each use. Remove all plants, animals and mud before moving to a new waterbody.



## Lake Sustainability Update: Low Wake Markers

"Low wake" markers were installed as part of the implementation of the <u>Kashwakamak Lake Sus-</u><u>tainability Plan</u> in our quest to slow boats down to create little or no wake and thereby help the erod-ing shorelines in narrow channels.

The KLA finished complying with Transport Canada's regulations for private marker "information" buoys on a non-regulated lake. Gord, our President and Pete our Lake Steward, re-positioned and relabelled all of the low wake markers around the lake with a covering sticker with reflective material. As part of this effort they took pictures at each location along with the GPS location and marked the positions on the map. Transport Canada now has the map in its possession and we received formal notice in late September that the "file" was closed.

However, based on the definition of placement of the new "Low Wake" information buoys, there are two that were previously placed near Fernleigh Lodge that are not in keeping with the 100 foot rule from shore. Kevin Philipps will be removing these markers this fall or early next spring to complete the compliance requirements.


## **Respect the markers!**

## What does "Low Wake" mean?

- ⇒ A "Low Wake Zone" is a designated area where boats should make low or no waves.
- ⇒ When you see a "Low Wake" marker it's time to slow your motor boat or personal watercraft down to **10 km/hour or less** to ensure that little or no wake is produced.
- ⇒ To do this, the engine must be put into idle speed when you're entering the designated zone.
- ⇒ Idle speed means the lowest speed a boat can safely operate while maintaining control of steering.
