Fall is upon us, and the leaves were at full colour on the Thanksgiving weekend. This summer it seemed as though the lake was back to more normal. With Covid restrictions lifted, the lake seemed more alive than it has been for the previous couple of seasons. The summer culminated in the 3rd annual concert by Mountain Head in Whitefish Bay. Approximately \$5,000 worth of food and donations were raised for the local food bank. Great to see that kind of give back to the local community.

Increase in Members!

We currently have **354 members** (337 Regular and 17 Associate) which is an increase of 5 from the spring report. We had more than the normal quantity of cottages change hands this summer. The association ended up with a net gain

in members and there are still a couple of new member forms to be submitted. Membership renewal is in January of every year. The KLA has two types of memberships available:

Regular Members – Every 911 address is entitled to one regular membership with voting privileges. Additional family members at the same address can join as associate members.

Associate Members – Associate members have all the benefits of the regular members but do not have voting rights. This type of membership is great for properties where several families share the same cottage. This category of membership is also for people who stay at one of the campgrounds or lodges on the lake and want to be a



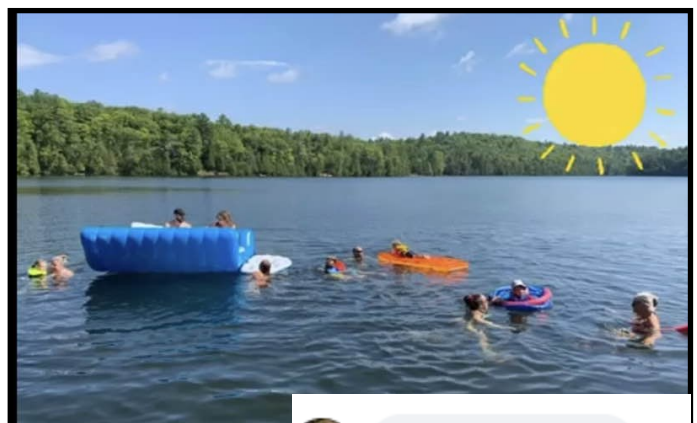

Membership Renewal – January 2023

Thank you to everyone who chooses to pay their dues through e-transfer. It is a huge timesaver! 2023 membership due invoices will be emailed in January and we appreciate your prompt payments.

Some Road Association Dues include KLA Membership Fee

Just a reminder that cottagers who are members of the South Shore Road Association, Silver Mine Road Association and the Kashwakamak Cottage Association pay their KLA dues through their road associations.

Accounts Receivable

At October 6th our accounts receivable is \$610. Of that, \$50 is owing for newsletter advertising

Bank Balance

Our bank balance at October 6th is roughly \$9,500. Included in that is approximately \$3,400 that is on reserve for lake sustainability projects. As well, we have received membership dues for future years in the amount of \$345. And, as in the past, the Board of Directors has agreed to always maintain a \$2,000 balance minimum in the account.

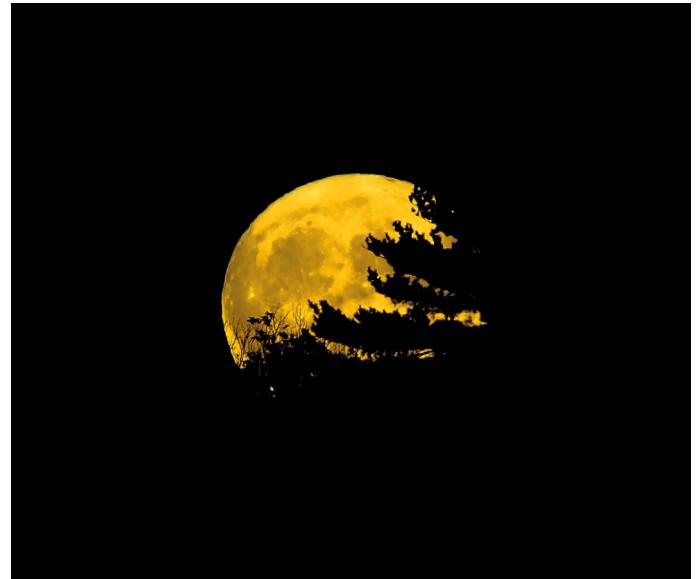

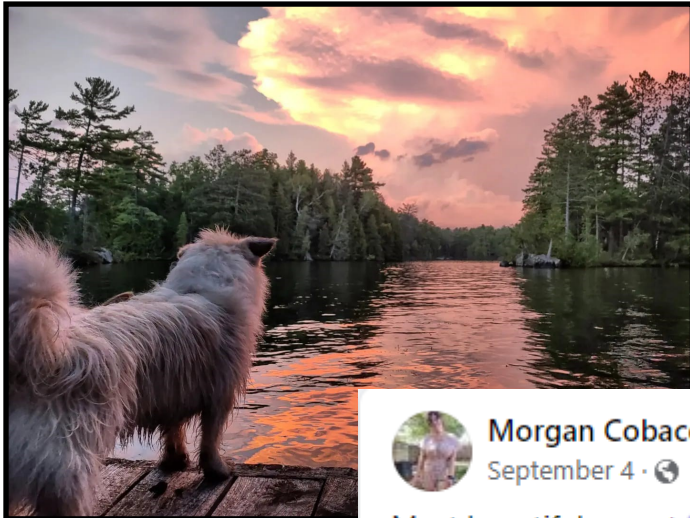

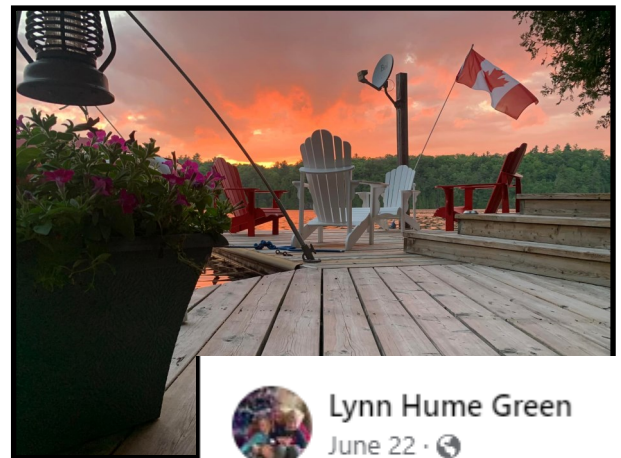

Lake Steward's Report - Pete Johnson

I hope everyone had a blast this summer. Beautiful fall colours are upon us once again.

Hazard Markers

After receiving reports of markers floating free this summer, which normally only occurs in early spring, we inspected several marker chains and found them extremely corroded. To date 29 markers have been reinforced with new insulated metal cable starting from just east of Fernleigh to the narrows entering Mitchell Bay. The cables have to be connected using a snorkel and mask so wind conditions, water, and air temperatures have to be favorable.



Volunteers make a difference!

I would like to thank Matthew Johnson and Jim McIntyre for their help with the markers this summer. I hope to complete the upgrades next summer, and in the meantime, if you find a free-ranging marker

let me know and I will pick it up when I can.

Invasive Species Sampling

As your KLA Lake Steward, I also participated in the invasive species sampling program via [IsampleON](#) earlier this summer. This is an invasive species monitoring and awareness program offered by the Federation of Ontario Cottagers' Associations, (FOCA), to which the KLA belongs, along with the Invasive Species Centre (ISC).

New this year was the ISC's [eDNA](#) sampling which enables early detection of invasive species. eDNA samples are taken for suspended DNA from the targeted invasive species. This method is far more sensitive than actually trying to catch the little critters. I will let you know the results this spring.

Water Clarity

Water clarity was down at least half a meter from normal throughout the summer. I attribute it to the

storms and the massive amount of sediment released into the watershed during the May Derecho storm, as well as when rain hits all the ripped-up roots etc. Fishing was below average for me personally this season and I noticed lower than normal weed growth in our bay. Could it be due to the reduction in water clarity? Or bad fishermen? Who knows?

I hope you can make it up to Kash this winter.

Notice re: KLA Low Wake and Hazard Markers

Each spring, and throughout the season, on behalf of the Kashwakamak Lake Association (KLA), Low Wake and Hazard Markers are placed, and/or checked around the lake in an effort to mark some of the lake's shoals, rocks, boulders, narrow passages etc. While best efforts are made to mark the most hazardous areas, it is not realistic to be able to mark everything, especially in areas that are close to shore or have little boat traffic.

- It is critical that boaters realize that these **MARKERS** are **NOT** navigational buoys. Instead, the markers are intended to call attention to **SOME** of the lake's hazards.
- **EVERY** individual operator of a watercraft is solely responsible for safe boating, including the avoidance of any marked or unmarked water hazards.
- While we try to identify and mark hazards, the KLA is not responsible for ensuring all hazards are marked, or continue to be marked.

North Frontenac Liaison Report - Marilyn Boston

I hope everyone has had the opportunity to enjoy some of the beautiful fall weather at the lake! With the Municipal Election now in progress much of the attention has been on the candidates and their platforms. Following the October 24 election, the KLA directly and/or through the North Frontenac Lake Association Alliance (NFLAA) looks forward to establishing new relationships and/or renewing current ones, as we work with the new North Frontenac Council on Lake Sustainability and issues most important to our membership.

Short-Term Rentals a Hot-Button



The [Federation of Ontario Cottagers' Association](#), (FOCA) reports that Short-Term rentals are a hot-button issue in many Municipal elections across Ontario. The [North Frontenac Lake Association Alliance](#) (NFLAA) is part of a committee made up of Council representatives from North, Central and South Frontenac and Addington Highlands, that has produced a Report with recommendations on Short-term Rentals. I sit as the KLA's representative for the NFLAA. Shorelines 'not a backyard swimming pool'

In order to support wildlife and protect our lake, [Watershed Canada](#) recommends that cottage owners keep **75% of their shorelines natural**. *"Our lakes are not a backyard swimming pool. It's a living ecosystem,"* says Barbara King, Executive Director Watersheds Canada. King indicates that many cottage owners don't understand the importance of maintaining natural shorelines to water quality and the wellbeing of aquatic and land-based wildlife.

During our July 2020 Love Your Lake Shoreline Assessment effort, our Kashwakamak "Love Your Lake Survey" highlighted that many of the cottages on Kash have not maintained a natural shoreline. The attached video provides a good overview of what a natural shoreline looks like (*and doesn't look like*), and why it is so important to maintain a natural shoreline:

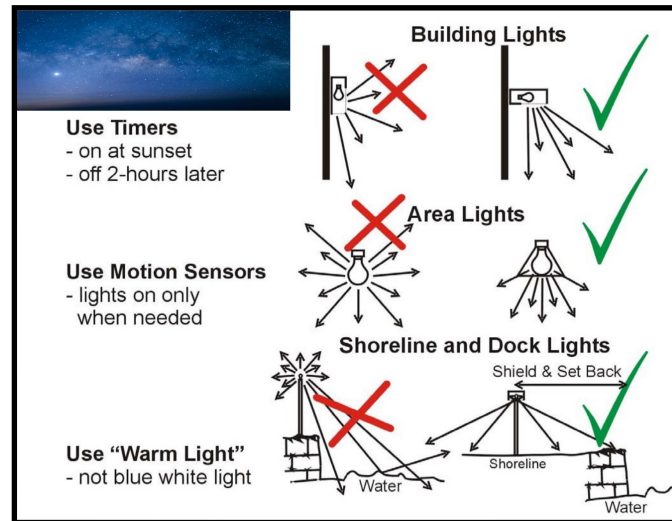

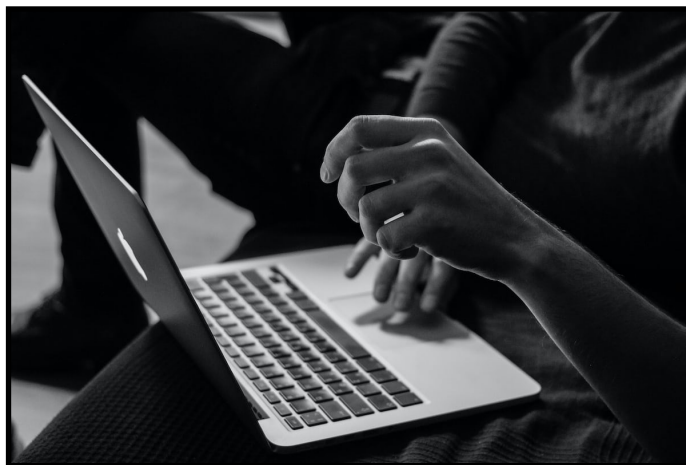

We will do a call out once we know more, but if you're interested, or have any questions please email me, president@kashwakamak.ca or give me a call at 613-806-2355.

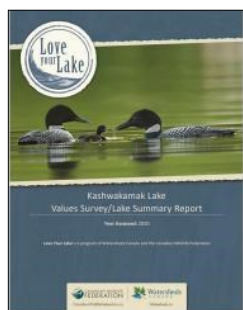
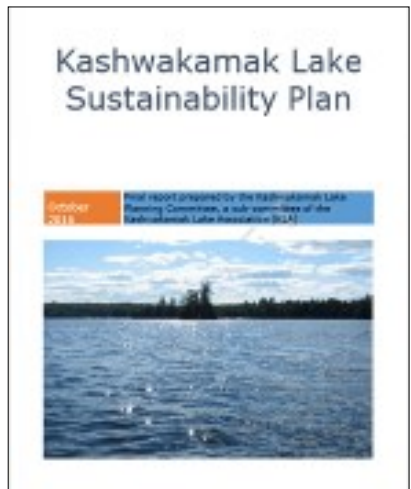

On Saturday September 17th, a truly beautiful day, KLA members gathered for the first time in 3 years at Fernleigh Lodge to enjoy the KLA fall dinner and charity auction. People gathered under blue skies to enjoy their pre-dinner cocktails with friends and neighbours, to peruse the various items in the Silent Auction, as well as to view the items being offered in the Live Auction.

Sandy and Bob Allin manned the welcome table where guests could pick up their tickets and leave the stubs for the three door prizes which were presented early in the evening. Bob was busy with the 50/50 raffle which netted \$180 for the Land O' Lakes food bank in Coyne, and the same for the lucky winner.

Following introductions by Gord Hunter, MC dinner was served at 6:00 pm. Starting with a Caesar salad (including fresh cooked bacon), followed by Melissa Phillips's popular air fried chicken, fresh carrots, green beans, mashed potatoes and gravy, and as always fresh baked buns. Throughout the evening the guests kept their eye on the Silent Auction and during coffee/tea our Auctioneer, Doug Galt performed his magic.
