Lake Steward's Report - Pete Johnson

Welcome to the spring of 2023 on **Hazard Markers** Kashwakamak Lake.

We had an unusual winter with regards to lake ice conditions. The lake didn't freeze over until the second week of January. We have often skated just after Christmas in previous years. This spring the ice off occurred April 16th which is around the average.

Water Quality – spring readings

I'm happy to report that the lake's total phosphorus level has remained relatively steady since 2002 at about 7 ug/L. The provincial water quality target is <20ug/L. Likewise, calcium levels in the lake have been relatively steady since 2002 at about 14 mg/L. In addition, my annual spring sample results of calcium and total phosphate agree with the MVCA results taken every 5 years.

I will be continuing the chain replacement on the shoal markers this summer. Most markers in the west end of the lake still need repair. If there are any issues with the markers, please contact me, lakesteward@kashwakamak.ca.

MVCA 2023 Sampling – Kashwakamak is included!

Kashwakamak Lake is on the MVCA sampling rotation this year for their **Integrated Monitoring Program**. You can read more on page 9. I will bring the findings to you when they become available.

2022 Invasive Species Sampling – Results are in!

The results are in from last year's invasive species sampling. I'm happy to report that there were no zebra mussel eDNA material or zebra muscle villagers detected.

Unfortunately, the **spiny water flea** was detected. These are tiny invasive crustaceans that eat zooplankton which competes directly with new fish hatchlings. All boat launches now have signs instructing borders on how to avoid introducing invasive species to our lake. Please help us keep these invasive species to a minimum!

Notice re: KLA Low Wake and Hazard Markers



Each spring, and throughout the season, on behalf of the Kashwakamak Lake Association (KLA), Low Wake and Hazard Markers are placed, and/or checked around the lake in an effort to mark some of the lake's shoals, rocks, boulders, narrow passages etc. While best efforts are made to mark the most hazardous areas, it is not realistic to be able to mark everything, especially in areas that are close to shore or have little boat traffic.

- It is critical that boaters realize that these **MARKERS** are **NOT** navigational buoys. Instead, the markers are intended to call attention to **SOME** of the lake's hazards.
- **EVERY** individual operator of a watercraft is solely responsible for safe boating, including the avoidance of any marked or unmarked water hazards.
- While we try to identify and mark hazards, the KLA is not responsible for ensuring all hazards are marked, or continue to be marked.

North Frontenac Lake Association Alliance (NFLAA)

On May 19th the North Frontenac Lake Association Alliance (NFLAA) met with the North Frontenac (NF) Council to review key focus areas that the NFLAA would like to be addressed in the North Frontenac Strategic Planning process that is currently underway. - ⇒ Given that the 2022 NF Report demonstrated continuing low levels of voluntary Septic Inspections, it's increasingly important to revive discussion on how to move forward.
- ⇒ Recommend a step-by-step approach to build upon the current system toward a mandatory system that can achieve the level of inspections required to protect our waterways and environment.

Drone footage - Eurasian milfoil

Starting this August my son and I plan on taking pictures from a drone of areas on the lake that are susceptible to Eurasian milfoil. By comparing weed density year over year, we can get an idea if there is a serious trend occurring. We'll let you know in advance when and where we'll be flying so you won't be alarmed.

Kashwakamak Lake Dam – Decision to be made – decommission, rehabilitate or replace

The Mississippi Valley Conservation Authority (MVCA) has retained McIntosh Perry Consulting Engineers Ltd. To complete a Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) for the Kashwakamak Lake Dam. Our dam was built more than 100 years ago is reaching the end of its useful lifespan. The deteriorating condition of the dam necessitates that a decision be made on whether to decommission, rehabilitate or replace the existing dam within the next five years.

Short Term Rentals (STRs)

- ⇒ From Sept 2021 – Aug 2024, the Joint Township/NFLAA Working Group (North, South and Central Frontenac and Addington Highlands) extensively researched the topic of STRs and gathered Ontario-wide experience.
- ⇒ The report, a policy framework and foundation for review by the 4 Townships has a wide scope broadly covering all aspects of STR's.
- ⇒ Unfortunately, the Report has not been reviewed or acted upon by council.
- ⇒ Request that Council mandate CAO NF to convene discussions with the CAO's for the other 3 Townships in line with the recommendations contained in the Report to review and identify next steps.

Lake Carrying Capacity

- ⇒ The current NF Official Plan contains references to 'lake carrying capacity' – consider the physical, environmental, social and economic aspects of waterfront development.
- ⇒ Request to Council to prioritize completion of this work and that NFLAA be fully engaged in the process.

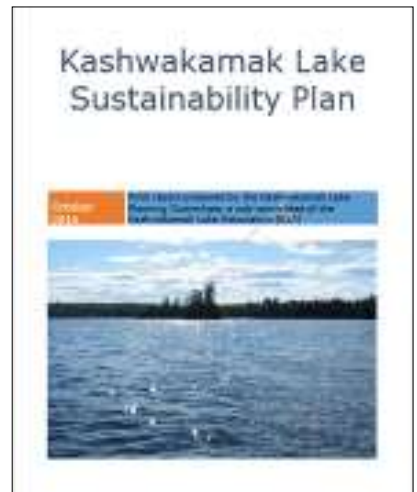

MVCA – Kashwakamak Lake is part of the 2023 Integrated Monitoring program

At a recent Lake Alliance Meeting, the MVCA shared its [Integrated Monitoring Report for 2022](#). Their main focus was the lakes in the Fall River sub watershed and they also visited Dalhousie Lake and Mississippi Lakes. Their stream biological monitoring program continued to be reduced due to Covid impacts on their workload capacity, however a number of temperature loggers were successfully launched throughout the watershed providing valuable data on aquatic habitat type and quality.

Great news!

This year their sampling rotation brings them to the top end of the watershed visiting **Mazinaw, Kashwakamak, Big Gull, Shabomeka-Kiskebus, Malcolm-Ardoch**, Mosque, and Marble, as well as Dalhousie and Mississippi Lakes in the lower end.

Watershed Report Card

MVCA has also now published a brochure version of the [Watershed Report Card](#) based on water quality results and mapping data from the past five years. Things continue to look good in our watershed and this puts the emphasis on preserving what we have. While this analysis helps us target restoration promotion in lower scoring areas, all our sub watersheds can benefit from maintaining, enhancing or restoring shorelines and wetland habitats.

Important: Neighbours Saving Neighbours – AEDs for volunteer responders

There's a new program called **Neighbours Saving Neighbours (NsN)**. It puts automated external defibrillators into the trained hands of volunteer responders across rural areas of Frontenac County. The idea is that NsN volunteer responders are dispatched by 911 operators via mobile device to possible nearby cardiac arrest emergencies. They may begin CPR and AED treatment in the critical minutes before paramedics arrive. It's time that could save a neighbour's life.

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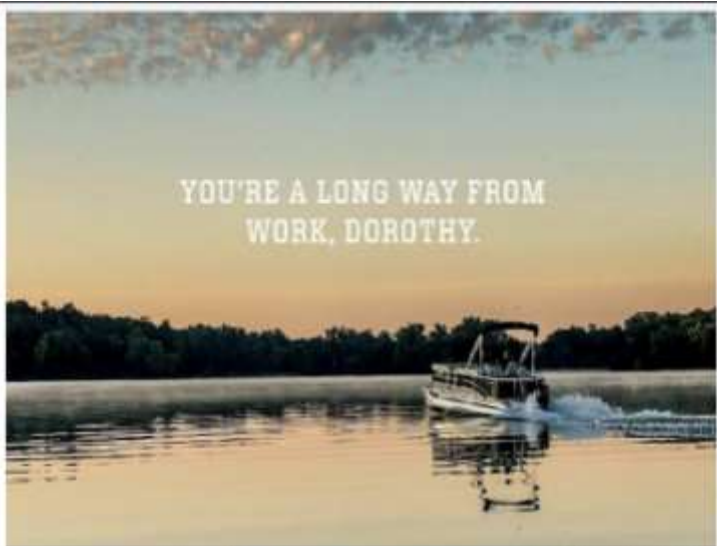

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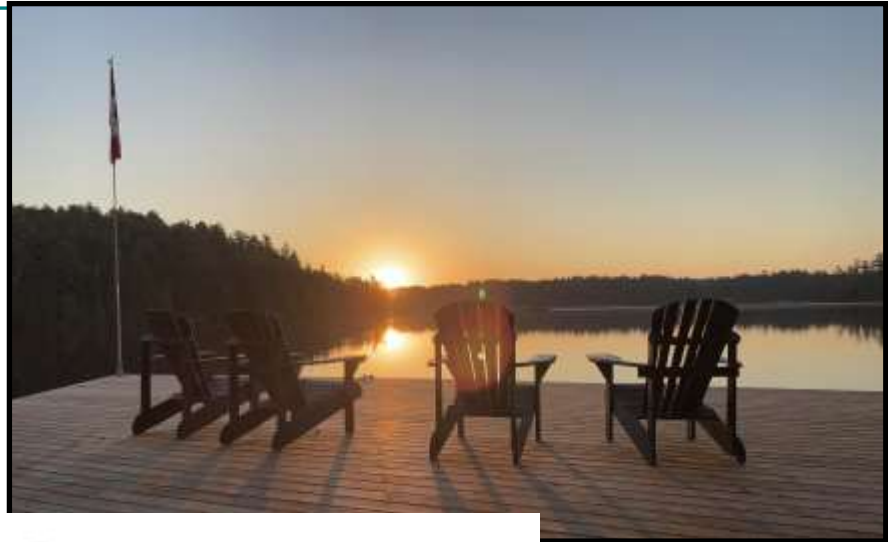
